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NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS RELATED TO DEATH

72 year-old male with a history of renal and liver disease was receiving home health care due to difficulty with mobility and self care. He was reported to have received regular herbal treatments in addition to prescribed medications.

Autopsy shows stage II renal disease, and mild-moderate liver damage. Neither condition is judged to have contributed to his death. Visual inspection revealed red skin, primarily on the face and neck, as well as high mucosal viscosity in the mouth and nasal passages (dry mouth).

Cardiac and respiratory musculature showed evidence of paralysis at the time of death.

Stomach contents included partially digested lentils, carrots and crushed leaves of unknown origin. Subject is estimated to have eaten within 2 hours of death.

In my opinion, Lionel Lyttelwhakker died from cardiac and respiratory failure as a consequence of acute anticholinergic toxicity, due likely to intentional or inadvertent ingestion of a substance containing a lethal concentration of alkyloids. Depending on the substance consumed, concentrations as low as 20-40 ng/ml could be considered lethal.
